LSP Work Group Activities Update: January 2019

Summary: There are a total of eight work groups for the Library Services Platform project: Acquisitions/Electronic Resource Management, Analytics, Cataloging, Circulation, Discovery/User Experience, Instruction, Professional Development, and Systems. Several calls to participate in the work groups were released during the 2018 calendar year, resulting in membership of over 100 librarians across the California Community College system.

Acquisitions/Electronic Resource Management

Priorities include:

- Licensing, vendors, loading of records, how resources can be shared at a Network Zone, Community Zone, Institutional Zone.
- Ensure content appears, is indexed, has successful links, and database content is updated on a regular, seamless, automated with no glitches basis.

The work group's current focus is drafting best practices of the implementation of the Films on Demand Master Index Collection database of which 72 institutions subscribe and currently does not supply indexing in the master Alma/Primo index.

Analytics

The Analytics work group is working on gaining access to analytics functionality in a production environment of Alma. In the interim, the group has spent its time discussing how it can contribute to the larger community.

The work group intends to:

- Identify important reports in a number of different areas.
- Where reports require additional configuration, produce documentation on configuration or, if possible, roll out preconfigured versions to CCC libraries.
- Produce guides to locating data needed for critical surveys such as the Chancellor's Data Survey, IPEDS etc.
- Identify opportunities for gathering aggregate information on a system-wide basis.

Cataloging

Recommendations:

The Cataloging work group has recommended that each library participating in the migration subscribe to OCLC cataloging and metadata services; advantages include constant updates to the master record and the OCLC number used as the primary match point for records in the Network Zone.

The Cataloging work group has recommended performing a reclamation project; advantage being if the OCLC number is used as the primary match point for records in the Network Zone, then the reclamation process will reconcile records that are missing an OCLC number.

Current Tasks:

The Cataloging work group recognizes the need for a process to govern the Network Zone and is working on a recommendation.

The Cataloging work group is meeting with cataloging librarians from the CSUs and representatives from Ex Libris to gather more information in order to put together a proposal on how to govern the Network Zone.

The Cataloging work group plans to produce an FAQ/Best Practices Wiki page regarding the Network Zone.

Discovery/User Experience

- Drafted recommendation on the discovery search interface, at the request of the Governance Committee:
 - Recommend that all CCC Libraries refer to discovery search by a single name: OneSearch.
 - Recommend that a logo be provided (but not required) for CCC Libraries to use, if they would like. We
 recommend that if possible, we use the same logo used by the CSUs. Choices about size, color, and placement
 should be left to the individual libraries to decide.
 - ***Note that the Committee has not voted to approve recommendations.
